Welcome to the 8th Diagnostic and Interventional ESNR Spine Course!!

During last 10 years, there has been and incredible increase of "minimal invasive" procedures for spinal diseases, and a variety of devices has been developed focused on the possibility to perform "minimal surgery", based on small cut incision, no significant muscles and ligaments damage, maintaining the normal anatomy as intact as possible. The selection of the patients is the key point to obtain the best results for our patients and this cannot been obtain without knowing diagnostic features and clinical evaluation of the patients. This is the reason organizing such as a diagnostic and interventional course mixing knowledge and experience.

Imaging guided procedures allow us to perform the best treatment for our patients reducing the risk of complications and malpositioning of the devices. A second great advantage of minimal invasive surgery is the reduction of deep anesthesia (particularly in debilitated or elderly patients). A third advantage of those procedures is surgical time reduction (complex procedures can be performed generally between 30 and 60 minutes), recovery time after surgery (patients is discharged usually between 12 and 48h) and post-op rehabilitation time.

For this reason we have this worldwide expert meeting of new minimally invasive techniques in spine treatment, including multiple disciplines such as Neurosurgery, Neuroradiology, Radiology, Radiotherapy, Oncology, Orthopedics, Anesthesia, and Pain Therapy to analyze from different point of view our main topics of the spine pathology as Low Back Pain, Spinal Instability, Spinal Canal Stenosis and Vertebral lesions, briefly analyzing biomechanical and clinical issues, widely evaluating "how-to-do it" and "how to manage".

We deeply hope that all our efforts in assembling so wide variety of Expert will catch up the goal.

Destination Catania

The Town





Catania is the second largest municipality of Sicily and one of the 15 metropolitan cities Italian. Catania was originally a Sican settlement, and was later re-founded by the Greeks (Calcidesi) in 729 BC with the name of $K\alpha\tau\acute{\alpha}\nu\eta$. It has a long history characterized by various rulers whose remains now enrich the artistic, architectural and cultural heritage. Under the Aragonese dynasty was the capital of the Kingdom of Sicily.

Throughout its history has been repeatedly affected by dramatic eruptions (the most impressive in historical times, is that of 1669) and earthquakes: the most catastrophic occurred in 1693, which destroyed almost the entire city. The two most important natural disasters of late seventeenth century (the eruption of Etna in 1669 and the earthquake of Val di Noto in 1693 were the start of a rebirth, transit to modernity: after this event, in fact, the city was rebuilt by Vaccarini: the baroque old town, unique (Baroque "Bugnato") is a UNESCO World Heritage in 2002.

The town lies at the foot of the Etna, the highest active volcano in Europe, easy to reach with many tourist services available, which offers visitors ever-changing scenarios, covered with snow in wintertime, and "Martians" sightseen during the summer.

The Oncology Institute of the Mediterranean (IOM) is one of the highly-specialized oncology departments existing in Sicily. It comprises a range of initiatives aiming at creating clinical and pre-clinicalwork of high scientific and critical standards and responding to both therapeutic and researchneeds in the oncology and non-oncology field. Recently, a newly department dedicated to degenerative and neoplastic spine disease treatment using all minimal invasive, fully X-ray & CT-guided, surgery has also been developed. A close interplay between the clinical and the research activity is what makes it a reference center for clinical and pre-clinical oncology, thus allowing it to offer: patients'admission to hospital and care (**IOM**), the implementation of translational research (**IOM-Research**), the provision of research services and spaces for companies and/or start-up operational units seeking a fertile interaction between research and clinical practice (**IOM-Research and Campus**).

OPERATIONAL UNITS: Medical Oncology, Oncohaematology, Autologous Bone Marrow Transplantation, Palliative Care and Paediatric Pain, General Surgical Oncology, Breast and Reconstructive Surgery, Thoracic Surgery, Neurosurgery-Minimal Invasive Spine Surgery, Urology, ENT Maxillofacial Surgery.

IOM Foundation is a nonprofit organization that began as a result of the propensity to research of the Oncology Institute of the Mediterranean in Viagrande. It aims to pursue and disseminate scientific research in the field of oncology, to engage in cancer prevention and in raising public awareness of early detection of cancer, as well as to promote training in oncology.

Rem Radiotherapy operates within the Department of the IOM; it is a private facility dealing with radiotherapy, nuclear medicine and diagnostic imaging.

You can reach Catania by sea thanks to:

Naples -> Catania ship by Tirrenia (www.tirrenia.it - TTT Lines: www.tttlines.it) Genova -> Palermo ship by Grandi Navi Veloci - Passeggeri, Merci e Crociere (www1.gnv.it) and keep on by car on the A19 Palermo- Catania highway, until km 19.

BY CAR

For vehicles coming from Milan the best way is the A1 Naples-Milan highway, keep on Salerno - Reggio Calabria highway until the highway exit for Villa San Giovanni. Then board a ship to Sicily.

Messina- Catania: A18 highway, until km 18 Palermo- Catania: A19 highway, until km 195
